



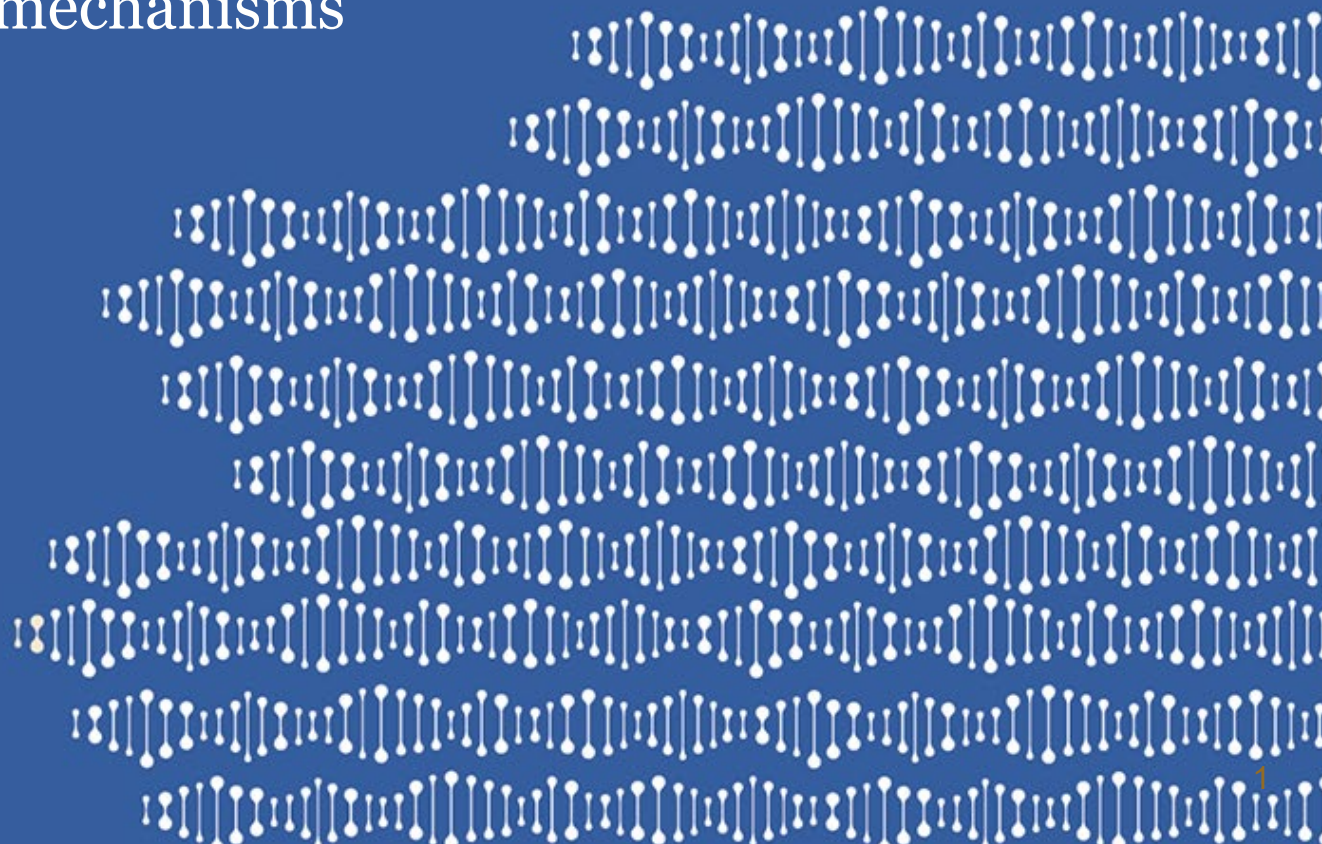

CPRIT Prevention Program Goals and Priorities

Goals

- ✓ Prevent or reduce the risk of cancer or detect it early
- ✓ Fund programs and services to help those most in need
- ✓ Build capacity to deliver prevention programs across Texas

Priorities

- ❖ Prioritize geographic areas of the state disproportionately affected by cancer incidence, mortality, or cancer risk prevalence
- ❖ Prioritize underserved and under-resourced populations



FY 2023 Funding Opportunities – RFA Mechanisms

Primary Prevention of Cancer

- ❖ Max of \$1 million for up to 36 months – new project
- ❖ Max of \$2 million for up to 36 months – initial expansion
- ❖ Max of \$2.5 million for up to 5 years – subsequent expansions

Cancer Screening and Early Detection

- ❖ Max of \$1 million for up to 36 months – new project
- ❖ Max of \$1.5 million for up to 36 months – initial expansion
- ❖ Max of \$2.5 million for up to 5 years – subsequent expansions

Dissemination of CPRIT-Funded Cancer Control Interventions

- ❖ Max of \$450,000 for up to 36 months

- New and Expansion projects
- Delivery of interventions to rural/MUA counties required
- Evidence-based
- Comply with national guidelines
- Collaboration of community partners

Primary Prevention of Cancer

RFA P-23.1-PPC



- Modifiable risk behaviors
- Multi-level interventions
- Assess social determinants to reduce disparities
- Advocate for or support policy
- Funding Table in RFA p. 11

Cancer Screening and Early Detection

RFA P23.1-CSD



- Comprehensive projects
- Delivery of interventions to rural/MUA counties required
- Comply with national guidelines
- Collaboration of community partners
- Required goal with objectives

Dissemination of CPRIT- Funded Cancer Control Interventions

RFA P-23.1-DI



- Only CPRIT-funded projects
- Increased funding and duration
- Assistance in implementation/grant application
- 2+ active dissemination strategies
- Publication in peer-reviewed journal required

Expansions

- Restate the project and components; don't assume reviewers know or remember
- Justify/explain expansion plans & feasibility
- Additional counties required in initial expansion
- Report progress to date with original project; separately include projected results with expansion project
- Differentiate between ongoing components and any new components, including counties served and # of services provided



Resubmissions

- One resubmission allowed
- Restate the project and components; don't assume reviewers know or remember
- Fully address summary statement overall weaknesses



Best practices – All Mechanisms

- Read the Instructions for Applicants (IFA)
- Outcome Goals & Objectives – RFA Appendix
- Application system (CARS) forms



Peer Review Evaluation Criteria

- Impact
- Project Strategy and Feasibility
- Outcomes Evaluation
- Organizational Qualifications and Capabilities
- Secondary – Budget and Dissemination



Multi-Stage Review Process

Peer Review

- Based on individual merit, not comparison

Programmatic Review

- ROI & impact, geography, cancer type, type of program in CPRIT portfolio

Program Integration Committee (PIC)

- Overall portfolio, budget

Oversight Committee

- Approve grant award recommendations



Ask Yourself

- Is your project evidence-based – have you explained and referenced the evidence base?
- Does your project comply with established & current national guidelines and criteria?
- Have you made any assumptions in your application?
- Have you included baseline data or a plan to collect baseline data?
- Have you explained how you **ensure access to treatment**?
- Is the evaluation plan fully developed and meaningful with measurable **OUTCOME** objectives? Does proposal answer ALL review criteria questions?
